Q) Why have the Parish Council Sent this questionnaire, what will my responses be used for? - This Questionnaire is an opportunity for you to give your opinions on matters that are important to you about the community you live in. Your answers will be used to help the Parish Council construct Romsley's Parish and Neighbourhood Plans. These plans will help the Parish Council to secure services and investments from the District and County Councils. They are also vital documents for influencing the planning authorities about what developments we wish to see in Romsley and what conditions, as a community, we want to place on these.



A visual inspection of the contents of all bags and containers may be undertaken on entry. You may bring reasonable quantities of alcohol for personal consumption, however excessive amounts of alcohol will not be allowed into event. For safety reasons please avoid bringing glassware, glass containers or glass bottles except for standard and sparkling wine bottles.
