**Q) Why have the Parish Council Sent this questionnaire, what will my responses be used for?** - This Questionnaire is an opportunity for you to give your opinions on matters that are important to you about the community you live in. Your answers will be used to help the Parish Council construct Romsley's Parish and Neighbourhood Plans. These plans will help the Parish Council to secure services and investments from the District and County Councils. They are also vital documents for influencing the planning authorities about what developments we wish to see in Romsley and what conditions, as a community, we want to place on these.

**Q) Why does my response matter? Will anybody actually read what I say? - Absolutely yes!!!!** We really need your answers and every questionnaire will count. 
