Welcome to the Autumn 2023 Newsletter from your Parish Council and my first as elected Chairman following the local election back in May.

It has been a very busy period since our first council meeting with many activities being covered in this newsletter including Romstock (page 5), the rearranged St. Kenelm's Day Celebration (page 4), play area refurbishment update (page 3) and details of our reformatted website (page 4).

Sadly after a number of dedicated years as councillor and vice chair Lesley Gray has decided to resign from the Parish Council. In the time I have had the pleasure to work alongside Lesley I have found her knowledge, professionalism and above all else, her steadying personality a huge asset in everything the council tries to achieve. Ian was co-opted at our meeting in July and brings a wealth of experience with him. In the short time Ian has been with us he has shown great enthusiasm and is keen to get involved in different projects.

Ian moved to Romsley with his wife in 2016 and lives on Dark Lane. He enjoys walking the local area and further afield and can regularly be seen walking his 2 dogs with his wife, occasionally dropping into the Swallows Nest on the way back. Over the years he has enjoyed Rugby Union both as a player and a spectator and enjoys watching most sports. Ian took early retirement from the railway in 2021 in his 38th year of service. He feels that now is a good time for him to give something back to the wonderful village and community he lives in by getting involved with the Parish Council.

As newly elected Parish Council with a four year term ahead of us we have been working hard reviewing our activities and identifying new initiatives, alongside the existing well established one's, that will bring additional pleasure to the place that we all live and enjoy. Footpath News - Stuart Smith, Paths Warden

It seems to have been a strange year for weather as far as footpath maintenance has been concerned, too muddy, too wet or too hot. The path by the scout headquarters is still awaiting its stone surfacing in spite of several reminders to the County Council. I'm still hopeful that it may be done this year before it becomes mud again.

There have been three Parish walks since the Spring Newsletter.

The Orchid walk saw 17 of us (plus a stray lost dog who joined us part way around) enjoying the nearby wildflower meadows. I was even able to identify some of the flowers thanks to the wonders of "Apps" and smartphones.

The "Out of Parish" walk was a circuit of the four hills that comprise the Lickey Hills and which included some of the lesser well known parts of the hills which were new ground for some of the 16 walkers.

The Hunnington walk which, owing to a change of plan, didn't involve Hunnington at all was the last of this year's walks and managed to clash with the Romsley Show. Nevertheless 10 of us had a very enjoyable walk which circumnavigated Uffmoor Wood and used some paths not used before on any previous Parish walk.

Nina and I would like to thank all of you who have joined us on these walks, you've been great company and made the walks so much more enjoyable.

Did you know?

There are 2837 miles of Public Rights of Way in Worcestershire comprising footpaths, bridleways and BOATs (Byways open to all traffic)

Romsley has 10.4 miles of Rights of way which includes 0.22miles of bridleway. Hunnington has 6.15 miles public footpaths. The next Parish walk will be the New Year walk on Saturday 6thJanuary 2024, until then enjoy the autumn and have a good Christmas!

What a fantastic time we all had. Lovely weather, good food and drink choices and great music. The warm weather helped to make this the most well attended Romstock yet. Thanks to the enthusiastic reception and the happy family atmosphere of Romstock, the artistes enjoy performing and tell us they are keen to return to future events.









Romsley Manor Farm Meadows

The 14 hectares (35 acres) of Romsley Manor Farm Meadows falls within the Arden Natural Character Area as defined by Natural England. The site consists of nine meadows, six of which are designated as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI), and contains neutral grassland and acidic heath grassland - both rare habitats in Worcestershire and nationally. Since being designated as a SSSI in 1993, they have been in decline due to overgrazing. Ownership of the site will allow us to maintain, monitor and restore the diversity and quality of the meadows, as well as improve connectivity across the landscape.



For the next seven months there will be work parties on Worcestershire Wildlife Trust's new nature reserve.

These are a series of wildflower-rich meadows that require careful management to preserve the remaining flora and encourage it to spread. Of course, it's not just about the wildflowers; the site is already known to be home to a wealth of invertebrates, birds and mammals. By mimicking sensitive traditional management we can help the wildlife that calls it home.

Our volunteers are vital to this management.

Volunteer jobs may include coppicing over-tall hedgerows, removing invasive weeds, reducing brambles and bracken, rejuvenating scrub and making repairs to fencing to facilitate grazing. There will be chances to get creative too - putting up bird-boxes and creating standing deadwood by ringbarking unwanted trees, for example.

The meadows are located just outside the main village of Romsley, and cover 14 hectares (35 acres) across nine fields, six of which are designated Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI).

Volunteers meet on the 3rd Monday of each month but dates may vary due to holidays and bank holidays:

September 25th – the fourth Monday! October 16th November 20th December 18th January 15th 2024 February 19th 2024

At the moment, it's hands-on with the reserve with the volunteer group concentrating on learning about the reserve and understanding the habitat. Knowledge of the reserve and the plant life will lead to more awareness of the many diverse species. We are actively working to recruit people who are interested in the development of the meadows and willing to lead future work parties.

Work parties will include raking cut bracken in the fields, tidying field edge margins, removing rubbish and planning future jobs to create a programme of activities for future work parties.
