St. Kenelms Day

Plans are well underway for our annual St. Kenelms Day celebrations which will be held at the playing fields on **Saturday 19th July.**

The full line-up is still to be confirmed but we are pleased to announce that the ever popular Stourport Brass Band will be entertaining us once again and the evening will conclude with a fantastic fireworks display.

For those that may not be so familiar here's a little background to the celebrations...

Romsley's rich history stretches back many centuries and one of the most interesting events surrounds the assassination of Mercian King Kenelm near the church at the start of the 8th century. There was much uncertainty over the events of his death as well as his true age at the time. However, following his death he was quickly canonised as a Saint who was venerated in Anglo-Saxon and Medieval England and mentioned in Chaucers "Canterbury Tales". St. Kenelms Feast Day is traditionally celebrated on the 17th July.

King Kenelm is an important part of our community's history and unique to Romsley. For centuries the parish has come together in July to celebrate these events including the church's annual festival and the parish council aims to ensure that these traditions are strengthened and continue.

As such we invite all residents and their families to the St. Kenelms Day celebrations which includes musical entertainment, a good sing song and finished off with an excellent firework display.

This is a free event to which you are invited to bring along your picnic hamper, a drink and table and chairs – we hope you and your families will join us.

Save the date: St. Kenelms Day - 19th July!!!!!

Gates open 6pm, entertainment from 7pm and finishing at 10pm with fireworks display.

Health & Well-being

Over the coming months the Parish Council will be exploring activities and events aimed at supporting residents health and well-being.

The following article introduces a running club, based in Hagley, that was formed to support women...

I'm Sarah, the founder of RunClub, who in February 2024 started to help three friends with their running. I had one simple goal, to create a safe and supportive space for women to thrive. From that small beginning our all-female RunClub has grown to nearly 300 strong, inspiring women, each with their own story, their own goals, and their own reasons for lacing up their running shoes. But this club is about so much more than just running.

A Safe Space for Women

We know that running can feel intimidating, especially for women. Whether it's concerns about safety, a lack of confidence, or simply not knowing where to start, too many women hold themselves back. That's why we built RunClub, a space where every woman, no matter her background, experience or ability can feel welcome and supported. From complete beginners to seasoned marathon runners, we train for all abilities and all distances offering everything from Couch to 5 programs to marathon training and everything in between. It doesn't matter if you're starting fresh or chasing a personal best. What matters is that you're here.

More than running: A Community of Strength

Yes, we run, but we also hike, train, and push ourselves beyond our comfort zones together. Because this club isn't just about fitness; it's about friendships, mental health, and building confidence. It's about meeting new people, stepping outside your comfort zone, and realising you're capable of more than you ever thought possible. The physical benefits of running are undeniable, but what's even more powerful is the mental transformation. The discipline, commitment, and consistency that running teaches spill into every area of life. And when you have a group of women cheering you on, lifting you up, and pushing you forward, that's when the magic happens.

Join Us—You Belong Here

Whether you're looking to get fitter, make new friends, or simply challenge yourself in a supportive environment, there's a place for you here. This club is full of strong, inspiring women and we'd love for you to be part of it. So take that first step, because the hardest part is just starting. And once you do, you'll never look back. Are you ready? Let's run.
